**Re: Conflict Minerals Certification and Policy Statement**

To Whom It May Concern:

**Regulatory Background**

The Conflict Minerals Rule, enacted under Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010, requires certain publicly traded companies to report annually on the presence of conflict minerals — specifically tin, tungsten, tantalum, and gold (collectively “3TG”) — that originate in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or adjoining countries (“Covered Countries”).

The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) has adopted rules implementing these disclosure requirements. The rules apply to manufacturers who file certain reports with the SEC and require them to disclose whether the products they manufacture, or contract to manufacture, contain conflict minerals that are necessary to the functionality or production of those products.

**Company Policy**

LightPath Technologies, Inc. / Visimid Technologies / ISP Optics / G5 Infrared LLC /Amorphous Materials LLC is committed to the responsible sourcing of conflict minerals throughout our global supply chain and to full compliance with the applicable SEC rules and regulations governing conflict minerals reporting and disclosure.

We further support the humanitarian objective of ending violent armed conflict in the DRC and surrounding Covered Countries that is financed, in part, through the exploitation of 3TG minerals. We believe that business has a responsibility to help break the link between mineral extraction and the financing of armed groups that commit human rights abuses.

**Due Diligence and Supply Chain Management**

To fulfill our obligations and uphold our values, L LightPath Technologies, Inc. / Visimid Technologies / ISP Optics / G5 Infrared LLC /Amorphous Materials LLC undertakes the following measures:

- Conducts reasonable country-of-origin inquiry (RCOI) with suppliers to determine whether 3TG minerals in our products may originate from Covered Countries or are from recycled or scrap sources.
- Require suppliers to provide conflict minerals declarations, including the use of the Responsible Minerals Initiative (RMI) Conflict Minerals Reporting Template (CMRT) where applicable.
- Gives preference to suppliers and smelters/refiners that are validated as “Conflict-Free” under the Responsible Minerals Assurance Process (RMAP) or an equivalent recognized program.
- Maintains records of due diligence activities and findings in accordance with applicable SEC reporting requirements and the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas.

**Certification**

To the best of our knowledge and based on the due diligence measures described above, LightPath Technologies, Inc. / Visimid Technologies / ISP Optics / G5 Infrared LLC /Amorphous Materials LLC

certifies that it has undertaken reasonable efforts to identify the source and chain of custody of 3TG minerals used in its products. We are committed to continuous improvement in our conflict minerals compliance program and will update our policies and procedures as regulatory requirements and industry best practices evolve.
